# Steering Committee Meeting, Washington D.C. 19 January 2018 Report of the New Jersey Caucus

The Caucus held a joint gathering with the New Jersey Library Association's History and Preservation Section on December 8<sup>th</sup> in Passaic County. We toured the American Labor Museum/Botto House and William Paterson University Special Collections.

The Caucus Archival Projects Evaluation Service (CAPES) continues sending consultants into the field to assist the New Jersey history community. The Advisory Committee is currently working on a revision of its guidelines to present for the Caucus's approval at the MARAC-Hershey meeting. Coordinator Frederic Pachman, along with the Chair, attended the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration of the New Jersey Historical Commission on December 4<sup>th</sup> in Trenton where CAPES was presented with a certificate of recognition. NJHC has provided the funds for the CAPES program since its inception 28 years ago.

Thomas J. Frusciano, University Archivist at Rutgers, was presented the 2017 Roger H. McDonough Librarianship Award on October 24<sup>th</sup> at Rutgers-New Brunswick during the fall meeting of the New Jersey Studies Academic Alliance. The Caucus is co-sponsor of the award which was established in 2002 to honor McDonough who served as State Librarian, 1947-1975.

The Caucus is also co-sponsor of the Paul A. Stellhorn Undergraduate Paper in New Jersey History Award. Winners for 2017 are Thomas Federowicz from Rutgers University for "Scarlet Knights, Red Crusade: An Analysis of the Great Red Scare at Rutgers-New Brunswick," and Samuel Fogelgaren from The College of New Jersey for "The Fight to Save the Last Frontier: Exclusionary Zoning and Environmental Protection at the Pequannock Watershed, 1975-1985". Both students will present their papers at the April 17<sup>th</sup> meeting of the New Jersey Studies Academic Alliance at Rutgers-New Brunswick. The Stellhorn Award was established in 2004 to honor this distinguished state historian and scholar.

The Facebook group currently has 108 members. There are 138 members of the Caucus and 107 signed up for the Caucus listsery. Six new members were welcomed.

Tour will include a journey through the Preservation Department, student processing areas, storage areas, and the digitization lab by archivists who will share stories of the collections that fall into their areas of stewardship.

"Preserving Rock and Roll History on the North Coast"

Northeast Ohio played a significant role in the history of popular music. Beginning with WJW-AM deejay Alan Freed's radio show, his coining of the phrase "rock and roll" to refer to the musical style, and his staging of the earliest rock and roll concerts, Cleveland continued to play an important musical role during the 1960s-1970s through the promotion of significant national artists and the development of FM radio. The region as a whole has produced seminal performers in rock music, including the Raspberries, Joe Walsh, Pere Ubu, Devo, the Dead Boys, and Chrissie Hynde of the Pretenders, and the local music scene continues to thrive through acts like Broccoli Samurai, Herzog, Lighthouse and the Whaler, and Wesley Bright and the Hi-lites.

Jennie Thomas, Director of Archives, will discuss the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame's local music collecting initiative, NEO Sound, an effort to preserve and make accessible the musical heritage of Northeast Ohio for future generations. Thomas' presentation will include the history and creation of the program, as well as the various outreach and programming efforts of the Library & Archives to engage local audiences and encourage community archiving.
