Newsletter MAA: Jodi noted that the Spring issue of the *MAA* is currently out and that hardcopy issues were recently mailed and will also be available at the upcoming MARAC meeting in Newark. For the Summer 2017 issue, they will be starting a new column that highlights the new MARAC Chair. It will consist of a series of questions answered by the Chair so that people can get to know him/her. The intent is for this article to appear once a year in the Summer issue.

 Project Management for Archival Processing Instructor: Vincent Novara, University of Maryland Full-Day Workshop: 9:00 am - 4:00 pm

This workshop focuses on introductory techniques and common tools for project management. Workshop participants will learn how to establish, define, plan, implement, and execute archival projects. Attention is given to strengthening prioritization skills and workflow planning as they pertain to processing projects executed by various levels of staffing, including the lone arranger. The workshop also addresses interpretive projects such as exhibitions and digital initiatives. Attendees will learn how to determine project goals and objectives, compose project objective statements, establish work breakdown structures, estimate project budgets, create project and communication plans, schedule and track tasks using Gantt Charts, and conduct a post-project evaluation. Throughout the workshop, standard project management terminology is applied to common archives tasks, and an overview is given of Earned Value Assessment.

Steering Committee Meeting, Newark 20 April 2017 Report of the New Jersey Caucus

The Local Arrangements and Program Committees welcome you to Newark !!

The Caucus met at Annapolis. Now that planning for Newark is finally coming to an end (yay!), the chair hopes to hold off-conference caucus gatherings in June and July.

As part of its Advisory Committee, the Caucus chair attended meetings in Trenton of the Advocates for New Jersey History. This group is currently monitoring several legislative bills that impact history, education, and records management in the State. This includes Bill S1784 which would separate and transfer Records Management from Department of State to Department of Treasury.

In February there was an announcement that the Governor's Office would be relocating to 225 West State Street, which houses several State cultural agencies along with the State Archives. All offices currently in residency would be evicted, including the Archives which would be moved to a storage facility outside of Trenton. After a swift, vocal and persuasive campaign by many history, genealogy and archival groups, including MARAC, the plan was revised to allow the Archives to remain at its current location.

The Caucus chair attended the Rutgers-New Brunswick School of Communication & Information Career Expo on March 20th, representing MARAC and the Caucus.

As a partner of the New Jersey Cultural Alliance for Response, the chair represented the Caucus at their annual meeting on March 22nd at the State Museum. Fred Pachman, coordinator for the Caucus Archival Projects Evaluation Service (CAPES), also attended and gave a short presentation about the program.

With much appreciation and many thanks for their help, Liz Caringola, Lauren Brown and Liz Novara assisted with the Caucus webpage being updated and expanded to include just about everything you ever wanted to know about the New Jersey Caucus!

The Facebook group currently has 98 members. There are 141 members of the Caucus and 122 signed up for the Caucus listserv. Ten new members were welcomed.
