

Delaware Caucus Report Steering Committee Meeting University of Baltimore July 22, 2016

- 1. The Delaware Caucus added four new members between March and May 2016. These members have been contacted and looped into past correspondence.
- 2. I solicited material from the caucus for the June edition of the *Mid-Atlantic Archivist*.
- 3. In order to gauge interest in a Delaware Caucus event, I administered a Doodle Poll on June 28, 2016. As of July 15<sup>th</sup>, nine members of the caucus expressed interest in attending an event, either social or educational, but there was no consensus about a location. Delawareans are historically averse to traveling above/below the C & D Canal, a sensibility reflected in the results of the poll, so I am looking into cost effective alternatives to meet travel preferences. General interest does not support multiple decentralized events at this time. I will continue to gauge interest periodically to monitor changes, though I believe that the results of the poll reflect a very content caucus.







# District of Columbia Caucus Report Steering Committee Meeting University of Baltimore July 22, 2016


- 1. Four new members joined the DC Caucus between March and May 2016.

# Steering Committee Meeting, Baltimore 22 July 2016 Report of the New Jersey Caucus

The Caucus met at the Historical Society of Haddonfield on July 6<sup>th</sup>, and will have a joint meeting with the History & Preservation section of the New Jersey Library Association at the Trenton Free Public Library on the 18<sup>th</sup>. An effort is being made to hold gatherings in all 21 counties. So far, the Caucus has met in nine with plans currently being made for two more.

Local Arrangements (tri-chairs Don Cornelius, Laura Poll, and Elizabeth Surles) and Program (co-chairs Jennie Levine Knies and L. Dale Patterson) Committees for MARAC-Newark (20-22 April 2017) have been meeting in person, by conference call, and via email. The theme is *Adaptable Archives: Redefine*, *Repurpose*, *and Renew*. A website was launched after Pittsburgh, a Twitter account has been created, and articles continue to be published in the *Mid-Atlantic Archivist* magazine.

Caucus Archival Projects Evaluation Service (CAPES) Coordinator Frederic Pachman applied to the New Jersey Historical Commission for a FY 2017 grant, and has promoted the program at meetings of the New Jersey Association of Museums and the Mid-Atlantic Regional Center for the Humanities. Consultants have already completed seven reports and another nine institutions are approved for visits.

The committee for the Caucus's "Innovative Archives Award" chose from four nominations this year. The winner, The League of Historical Societies of New Jersey, will be acknowledged at Archives & History Day in October. The League was chosen for their leadership role in the state's diverse history community and its efforts to highlight New Jersey's many archival resources and historic sites.

As part of its Advisory Committee, the Caucus Chair attended meetings in Trenton of the Advocates for New Jersey History. The Advocates published a position paper opposing revived legislation that would permanently separate the Division of Archives and Records Management. Several groups have publicly denounced the proposed bill, and the Caucus is working with them to gather more signatures.

As there is currently no state-wide sponsorship of, or program to celebrate Archives Month in October, discussion continued between the Caucus Chair and the State Archives to create an event.

The Caucus webpage was updated, with many thanks to Liz Caringola. The Facebook group currently has 92 members. There are 133 members of the Caucus and 114 signed up for the Caucus listserv. All members who were not on the listserv were contacted with directions on how to sign up. Nine new members were welcomed.

#### **New Members**

6 new members joined the VA caucus between March and May of this year. I sent emails welcoming new members to the caucus and answered questions about MARAC. Several members had questions about signing up for the caucus listserv and were not aware that they are not automatically added to the VA listserv when they become members.

#### **Virginia State Caucus meeting**

We met on June 10, 2016 at James Branch Cabell Library at Virginia Commonwealth University. The meeting was held later in the year than has previously been the custom in order to put some space between the Spring MARAC meeting and the caucus meeting. I received positive feedback from several attendees on the timing of the meeting, so we will likely continue to meet in late May or early June.

29 members attended and we continued with the successful lightning talks of previous meetings and had 3 presenters. The meeting concluded with a tour of VCU's newly renovated library and Special Collections areas.

#### Virginia Archives Month planning

The 2016 Virginia Archives Month Committee consists of 13 volunteers. The theme this year is Art in the Archives, which coincides with Artober VA – a month long celebration of arts and culture in VA, based out of Richmond. This year we hope to engage those outside of our typical user groups not only by highlighting a lesser-known aspect of archives, but also by encouraging the public to participate by creating something new. The images posted to the Virginia Archives Month Flickr page will be freely available to the public to use in some new, artistic way such as a GIF, collage, coloring page, or whatever they dream up. The deadline for image submission was July 8, and the design and creation of the poster will be completed by the Library of Virginia.

## **Disaster Relief in West Virginia**

Southern West Virginia was devastated by severe flooding in late June, and the recovery continues. At least two public libraries lost all books, computers, and furniture, and historical societies and churches also sustained damage to irreplaceable records. With the help of the WV Caucus, Nat DeBruin, former WV Caucus Chair, and the West Virginia Library Association, I have been spreading the word about the MARAC Disaster Relief Fund. Three institutions – the Rainelle Public Library, Shiloh Baptist Church, and Clay County Historical Society – have contacted me about applying for funds.

## **West Virginia Archives Month planning**

For the first time, the West Virginia Caucus is organizing events for a West Virginia Archives Month celebration. Four caucus members have volunteered to lead the effort and have begun to reach out to institutions across the state.
