Chair's Report

MARAC Administrator Tammy Hoffman resigned in August. The MARAC leadership discussed options for the future including contacting professional administration firms but that was determined not to be cost effective. Jim Gerencser is currently serving as acting administrator and will chair the search committee for a new administrator. A job announcement was put out and four candidates have been identified for interviews. We hope to have the new administrator in place at the start of the new year.

The disaster fund was depleted due to the flooding disaster in West Virginia. There was a fund raising drive during this conference and donations are appreciated.

The Regional Archival Associations Consortium has agreed to provide funding so that MARAC can have a seat at the National Council for History policy table. Jan Zastrow will serve as the representative for both MARAC and RACC.
